From Tristan Murail's sparse and ethereal "Feuilles à Travers les Cloches" to Linda Bouchard's densely mechanical "Liquid States", Standing Wave, Vancouver's cutting edge chamber ensemble, presents 21st Century music that morphs through time, space, and genre. The program will feature Canadian premieres of Kati Agocs's "Immutable Dreams" and Kaija Saariaho's "Serenatas"; Jocelyn Morlock's "marginalia", her tribute to Vancouver's legendary artistic shapeshifter Roy Kiyooka; as well a new work by Vancouver guitar hero Ford Pier.

Standing Wave is an ensemble of five exceptional musicians who perform contemporary music with virtuosity and style, cutting across musical landscapes with sharpness, wit and intelligence. The ensemble is equally comfortable performing complex chamber compositions, musique actuelle and works with electro-acoustics. Their unusual instrumentation, adventurous programming and dynamic performances combine to capture listeners' hearts and imaginations, placing Standing Wave at the forefront of Canada's new music scene.
